Outcomes for Students/Project

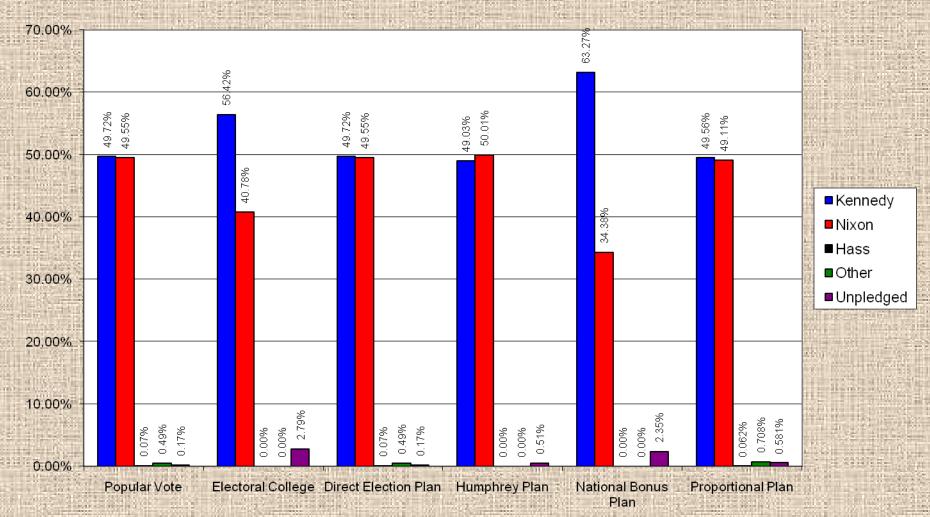
- Using graphics, identify and explain which, if any, states have an advantage in selecting the president using each plan
